St. Louis was one run to the bad when Miller strode up to the plate starting the last half of the eighth. Ashenfelter let loose a wild one and the ball roaked Dusty on the kneecap. Prout waited for a base on balls, putting men on first and second. O'Connor then sent in Forrest Ailworth, a youngster who formerly caught for St. Louis U., to hit for Catcher Green. The kid laid down a perfect bunt up the third-base line and beat it out for a hit. That filled the sacks with no one gone and set the stage for a gigantic killing. So far so good.

Castien number one sprained his ankle, and Goldsmith did the same, though it may be said that neither were up to varsity quality. Their work in running back punts was especially uncertain. Harry Castien is as yet in too poor physical condition to play his best game, so Ailworth is the right man at the right time.

Ailworth played third base for the varsity ball team and is a particularly speedy and heady man. His baseball has made him sure catching punts and he is a good open-field runner.
