### Rites held for Harry (Pete) Allen

Funeral services were held today for retired Army Col. Harry B. (Pete) Allen, 86, a Stanford University sports fan, assistant coach and timekeeper 25 years and former ROTC professor on the campus.

Col. Allen died Sunday at the Palo Alto Veterans Administration Hospital after being ill for several years.

Col. Allen, born in Missouri, spent his boyhood in Independence where he grew up with former President Harry Truman and later fought side-by-side with him in World War I.

He was an athlete himself, having excelled in football, basketball and baseball as a young man at Kansas University and Yale. He was forced to leave college to return home and later joined the National Guard be-
