CLEVELAND, May 5.—Cleveland defeated the Covington Federal League team here yesterday before a crowd which numbered 1,800 by the score of 4 to 1. The contest contained just enough good features to hold interest until the finish. Dusty Miller, late of Altoona, was hustled from the train into a uniform to start the local team on the right path. Miller looked just a trifle better than any pitcher Cy Young has displayed so far.

Sam Leever was forced to call upon three slabmen in an effort to win. Bill Bartley opened and progressed in fair fashion. He was yanked after Cleveland had scored two runs to let Matsche bat for him, and then a young man named Taylor carried on the mound for a few minutes—just long enough to demonstrate that he had no idea what he was doing.
