Beebe, one of the Indians' flingers who yesterday afternoon rolled from a train which brought him here from Detroit, looks upon the game of baseball as a business proposition pure and simple, and if he cannot make a success in it will desert the gentle pastime for something more remunerative.

Beebe is a slick looking youngster who appears as though he might have the goods. If he is a diamond he is far from being in the rough for his being experienced as a semipro player, has knocked off the jagged edges and he talks in a knowing manner of the game.

In the Way of Introduction.

Beebe comes from that Trolley league over in Indiana which has sent many ball players to the major and best minor leagues of the country. It was there that he got his early schooling and was often an opponent of "Red" Corriden. Corriden was with Logansport and Beebe with Peru.

Beebe spent a year touring the country as a member of the Cheyenne Indian team and last year was with Battle Creek the latter part of the season. Battle Creek was the worst bet in the South Michigan league.

Have Good Word for "Pa" Belt.

The new man is confident that if he is ever to make good he will do so under the masterful guidance of Father Belt. Corriden told Beebe about Belt and so did Jack Reardon, who gave the Keokuk leader a great recommendation.

But getting back to that business proposition—Beebe says he will be on the job to make the other pitchers hustle. He is going to strive to better himself and pave the way to a big league berth if he has the goods.
