'Chief' Bennett, 95, ex-catcher

Andrew "Chief" Bennett, a onetime catcher for the Pittsburgh Federals, the turn-of-the-century baseball team that pre-dated the Pittsburgh Pirates, died of heart failure yesterday at the age of 95.

Mr. Bennett died at the Greenville Regional Medical Hospital in Mercer County. A lifelong resident of Hazelwood, Mr. Bennett spent the final year of his life in Mercer,

Bowie Kuhn, baseball commissioner, knows his baseball history. He was discussing the old Federal League with George Smith, vice president of the Pittsburgh Umpries' Association, who played shortstop for the Pittsburgh Feds back in 1913. Kuhn recalled the names of several Pittsburgh players of that day — Deacon Phillipi, a pitcher; Chief Bennett, the catcher; and Red Callahan, an outfielder. The Feds played in Expo Park, which was located almost on the spot where the new Three Rivers Stadium stands.
