C.A.R. Presents Plaque In Honor Of Veterans Day

The Christian Reinhardt Senior Society, Children of the American Revolution, honored veterans of all armed services through one of the older Gregg County veterans, William Frank Bishop, in observance of Veterans Day.

Miss Elizabeth Moore, president of C.A.R. presented the honoree, a veteran of World War I with a boutonniere and a plaque in the district courtroom of the county courthouse. Miss Elizabeth Ballard and Miss Nancy Wheeler, C.A.R. officers, were also present.

Mrs. George Hardy Sr., representing the Captain William Young Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, Mrs. M. B. Griffin Jr. and Mrs. E. L. Foerster representing the Aaron Burleson Chapter, DAR, and Tom H. Welch, veterans vice officer of Gregg County, also participated in the observance of Veterans Day.

Serving continuously since 1961 as post commander of Veterans of WWI, Barracks No. 2687, Bishop presides at the meetings held on the first Sunday of each month at the Veterans of Foreign Wars hut. The barracks has 122 members.

William Frank Bishop was born Aug. 5, 1888, in St. Louis, Mo. While a youngster, he played professional baseball as pitcher with the Jackson Michigan Club, St. Louis and the Federal League and the Superior Nebraska baseball club.

Entering the service during WWI on May 7, 1918, in Dallas, he served overseas approximately six months. Discharged Jan. 24, 1919, at Camp Travis as

a sergeant, he was stationed in England while overseas.

Bishop married the former Dycie Polvido March 15, 1935, in Texarkana. She also served in the armed forces during WWII, entering service Aug. 11, 1943, in Dallas as a WAC in the army and served overseas for 16 months before being discharged Aug. 3, 1945, at Ft. Sam Houston.

The couple moved to Camp Switch after the war where he accepted a position as superintendent of Thompson, Harrison and Russell Oil Company and retired on his 78th birthday.
