Pitchers—Packard, Cincinnati Nationals; Stone, Oakland, California; Harris, Denver Western league; Baumgardner, St. Louis Americans; Blanding, Cleveland Americans; Hennig, Hogue and Hogan, with the Kansas City Federals last year.

Infielders—Stovall, manager, formerly with St. Louis Americans; Kenworthy, Sacramento, Coast league; Goodwin, Los Angeles, Coast league; Perring, Columbus American Association; Sapp and Deeringer, with Federals last year.

Outfielders — Chadbourne, Portland, Coast league; Kruger, Los Angeles, Coast league, and formerly with Cleveland Americans; Williams, St. Louis Americans.

A number of youngsters to be given try-outs are on the list.

Twelve of the players will go from here to-morrow night to Wichita Falls, Tex., for spring training.

## Col. Charles Brammell, 63, Ex-Athlete, Dies at Tyler

TYLER, May 7 (Spl). — Col. Charles H. Brammell, 63, retired Army officer who played professional baseball in his youth, died at his home here Wednesday.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a. m. Thursday in Christ Episcopal Church.

Brammell played semi-professional and professional baseball with teams in Texas and Minnesota. He was a close friend of Casey Stengel, manager of the New York Yankees, who was an early-day teammate.

He served nearly 30 years in the Army. He was commanding officer of Camp Fannin, near here, during World War II and previously served as professor of military science and tactics at

the University of Oklahoma.

He is survived by his wife, and two sons, Charles Richard and Phillip Harrison Brammell, both students at the University of Oklahoma.
