# Col. Charles Brammell, 63, Ex-Athlete, Dies at Tyler

TYLER, May 7 (Spl). - Col- the University of Oklahoma. Charles H. Brammell, 63, retired Army officer who played professional baseball in his youth, died at his home here Wednesday.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a. m. Thursday in Christ Episcopal Church.

Brammell played semi-professional and professional baseball with teams in Texas and Minnesota. He was a close friend of Casey Stengel, manager of the New York Yankees, who was an early-day teammate.

He served nearly 30 years in the Army. He was commanding officer of Camp Fannin, near here, during World War II and previously served as professor of military science and tactics at
