Wilmer Brickley, one of the most popular of present-day Duquesne University athletes, finished his two-year course in the law school last week and immediately left to join the aviation branch of the United States navy, in which he had enlisted some weeks ago. Brickley was almost the "Last of the Mohicans," for nearly all the older Bluffites have entered some branch of

the service.

Brickley prepped at Indiana Normal entered the university two falls ago.
