Brickley Leaves Bluff Campus For Aviation Service

Wilmer Brickley, one of the most popular of present-day Duquesne University athletes, finished his two-year course in the law school last week and immediately left to join the aviation branch of the United States navy, in which he had enlisted some weeks ago. Brickley was almost the "Last of the Mohicans," for nearly all the older Bluffites have entered some branch of the service.

Brickley prepped at Indiana Normal and entered the university two falls ago. He played a half on the football team and pitched and played outfield on the nine, playing in the field when not pitching for the sake of his batting. He is a brainy player in both football and baseball, and was active in coaching the younger Bluff teams, while not at practice with his own squads. Last spring he was elected captain of the 1918 baseball team—only the team was never formed because of war-time conditions, so he was a captain without a team.
