### EXPLAINS THE RULE.

The rule in question declares that no player "coming" from a "higher" league shall play in a minor league within thirty days of the close of the season. Reilley was for two years in the New York State league and was struck by lightning, which put him out of business for a time, but he has about recovered. The reason he was let go is simply that Manager Hendricks already has plenty of tried pitching material.
