## NATIONAL COMMISSION REFUSES TO REINSTATE CATCHER ERNEST DENNIS

Catcher Ernest Dennis is lost to organized baseball for jumping the Pa's Secretary Farrell of the National Association of Professional Baseball leagues, telegraphed President Walsh yesterday that he cannot reinstate Dennis. The message was received last night by Mr. Walsh.

This is the second time Mr. Farrell has ruled against Dennis. On the second request he asked for a detail statement of the facts connected with the suspension of the player and the complete data was filed with him. His answer is that Dennis must play the penalty for jumping a club with which he had signed to play.

Dennis, who has been in the city for a week waiting to learn the decision, will leave today for his home in Chicago. He has several offers to play independent ball in this section of the country, but prefers to return to Chicago where he can play with any number of semi-professional teams.
