Robert Adam DIETRICH

A 12APR1934 Detroit MI news article revealed: "Robert A DIETRICH, head of the Detroit division of the Kroger Grocery & Baking Co., says that retailing groceries is the most fascinating business of all. He went into it rather than playing professional baseball, and he liked baseball.

Back in 1910 Mr. DIETRICH played semi-pro baseball in Cincinnati. In 1912 he played with Maysville, KY, in the Ohio State League, in 1913 he went with Erie, PA in the Central League and joined the Columbus (OH) Club in the American Association in 1914. At the end of the season he began working in one of the Kroger branch stores in Cincinnati.
