Both showed pretty good form, and between them only eight hits were made. Uhlman, pitching with a lame arm, was swiped for 18 bingles. Chapman, Badel and Hicks lammed out homers. The Covington outfield covered lots of ground, while the infield worked well. Hicks, who was with a Cincinnati team in the United States League last year, put up a clever game behind the bat. Chapman led in the hitting, getting three bingles in four times up. Sunday the Federal Leaguers will play at Kokomo. Manager Leever will send Justus or Pfeister to the mound, with Bill Bartley held in reserve. The Kokomo Club is a fast one and the Covington boys will have to play good ball to win out. The score:

Dennis Hicks, former catcher of the Cincinnati team in the lamented U. S. League, said Friday that if a third league is started next year it probably will prosper.

"The time is ripe for it," said Hicks. "I've been talking to players in various parts of the country and they will support a third

league, provided, as in my case," and Hicks smiled sorrowfully, "they are shown the coin in advance."

Hicks told Magistrate Muller he had received only \$2.50 advance money from John J. Ryan, President of the old Cincinnati Club. Hicks was to have been paid \$150 a month. He sued
