Feeney to Manage Superior, Neb., Team

James F. Feeney, a St. Louisan who has been pitching ball in various Southern leagues for several seasons, left last night for Superior, Neb., to take up his duties as manager of the club.

Superior is in the Nebraska State League, and is considered one of the strongest towns of the circuit. Feeney will have several St. Louisans on his team this summer, among them being Scotty Kemplin, Henry Bishop, Eddie Green, James Begley, Paul Ost, Fred Schied, P. Schroeder, Ford Rush, E. Klugmann and Ed Sullivan. The first four of this bunch played with the Federal League last year.

Manager Feeney has a likely bunch of players signed up, as follows: James Begley, 1b, of the K. C. Federals; Henry Bishop pitcher of the St. Louis Feds; Scott Kempin, outfielder, also of the federals. Eddie Green, a catcher from the Feds and Texas leagues; Russ, a tryout pitcher; Klugmann, an infield tryout; Sullivan, a pitcher from the Regina league; Roy Lewiss, ss., of Troy, Ill.; then there are Obst, Schroeder, Jepson, Gray, Landreth, Brown and Thiessing of the old bunch. All making a likely outfit, and they will be here soon for practice.

Through the season, to the amount of \$100 apiece. Manager Feeney, who has been managing from the bench since the opening of the season, was fired yesterday and last night first baseman Begley and Kempin jumped the team, going to St. Louis. There has been a good deal of dissatisfaction among the directors and
