The squad of twenty-five players was too large to handle. Coughlin will be greatly pleased if he can secure four promising players from the recruits at work at the Fair Grounds. One of the most promising candidates for the team is Joe Menovsky, of Punxsutawney, an infielder. At every workout Coughlin has been giving this lad his personal attention. Joe Menosky Dies

A former Flint sports star, 64-year-old Joe Menosky was buried today from St. John Vianney Catholic Church after passing away suddenly Sunday from a heart attack. He lived at 2305 Clement St.

A native of Glen Campbell, Pa., he resided in Flint for 45 years. In his youth, Menosky played semipro baseball and professional basketball.
