FORMER LOCAL ATHLETE DIES OF INJURIES

Thomas Kleinfelter, 33 years old, of 6630 Butler street, former boxer and amateur football player in the Allegheny valley, died in his home yesterday afternoon from injuries suffered recently.

Kleinfelter was born in Sharpsburg but moved to Pittsburgh when a youth. He was a member of the backfield on the Sharpsburg Golden Eagle football team which held the Allegheny valley championship for a time.

Kleinfelter retired from athletics about 10 years ago to follow his trade of a structural ironworker. It was at his work that he received the injuries which resulted in his death. Besides his parents, he leaves his wife, Mrs. Mary Kleinfelter; three sons, James Kleinfelter, Thomas Kleinfelter and Jesse Kleinfelter; one daughter, Mary Kleinfelter; two sisters, Mrs. John Murray of Sharpsburg and Mrs. Henry Miller of Aspinwall, and one brother, George Kleinfelter of Cleveland, O.

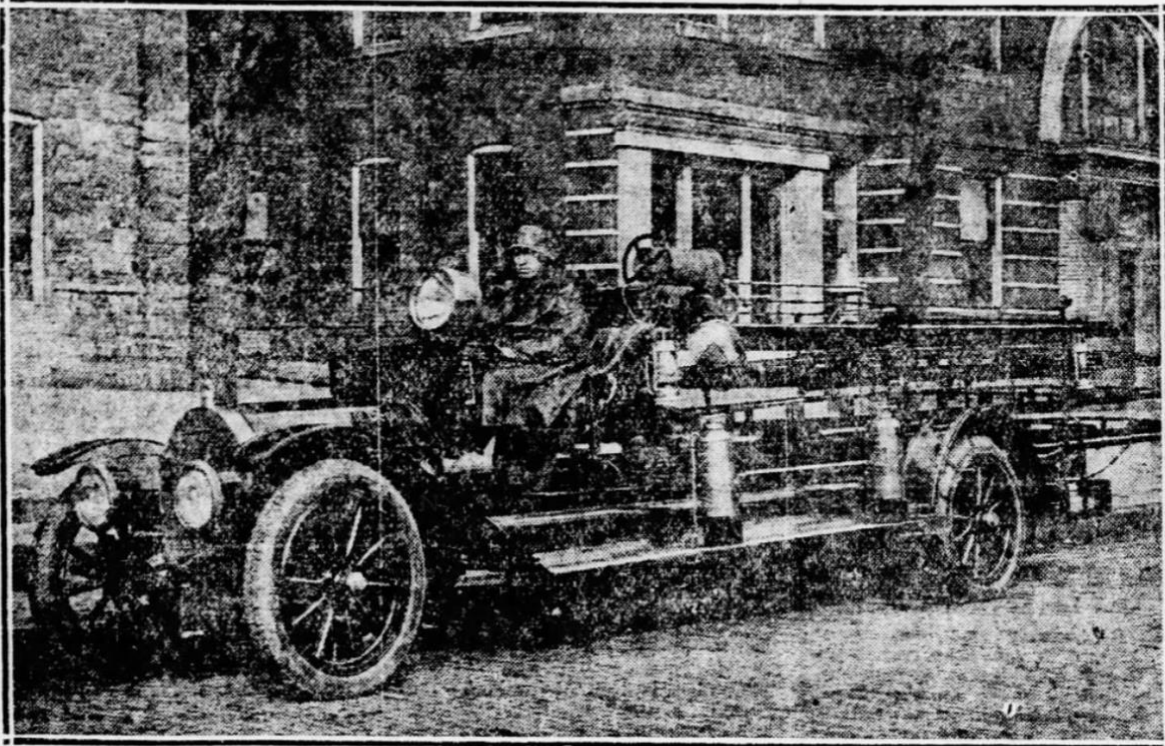
