After Jack Johnston, the Browns' left fielder, had been unconscious for twenty minutes as the result of being "beamed" in hitting practice, he awoke and shouted, "I'm not hurt, but O, my head!" Johnston was batting when Pitcher E. Mitchell, late of the defunct Blue Grass League, who had asked Manager Stovall for a trial, cracked the Texan on the back of the head with a fast ball. Johnston dropped like a log and was carried to the clubhouse. For awhile it was feared he was badly hurt, but after a doctor had been called in he was revived, and aside from a little dizziness was all right. He was taken home in Manager Stovall's automobile.

He played a part of last season with the St. Louis Browns and nearly killed a player named Jack Johnson by "beating" him. Mitchell was with the Paducah club in the Kitty League for a few months, during which time he pulled the club from a losing to a winning position. He was accompanied here by his father, Dr. Charles Mitchell, a St. Louis physician. Doctor Mitchell had a nervous breakdown and came here for a few days to rest and be with his son.

IDA WILLIAMS PLANNED TO BE WED NEXT MONTH

**ELMER MITCHELL, PITCHER ON
ST. JOSEPH (MO.) TEAM, WILL
ATTEND FUNERAL.**

ELMER MITCHELL, pitcher for the St. Joseph club of the Western League and a son of Dr. Charles Mitchell of 2000 North Taylor avenue, arrived in St. Louis yesterday from St. Joseph to attend the funeral of his fiancée, Miss Ida Williams.

Miss Williams died Sunday of a fractured skull, suffered Saturday night when she fell downstairs at 5935A Maple avenue, where she was employed as a companion and maid.

The funeral will be this morning from the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Longfellow boulevard and Lafayette avenue, to New Picker Cemetery.

A coroner's jury which investigated the death of Miss Williams yesterday returned a verdict of accidental death.

Miss Williams and Mitchell were to have been married next month, according to Dr. Mitchell, who was at the Williams home, 2632 Allen avenue, last night.

Dr. Mitchell, who was summoned to attend his prospective daughter-in-law, following the accident, said she did not seem to be hurt seriously. He said he was informed by telephone the following day that she was getting along very well.

A little later, he said, he received another message, saying that she had been taken to the Deaconess' Hospital, and within an hour a third message told of her death. He declared cerebral hemorrhage was the cause of death.

Miss Williams is survived by her mother, Mrs. Lulu Williams, and sister, Mrs. Edna Sihavy of 2504 Reber place.
