

Timothy J. O'Brien, Court Clerk, Dies

Timothy J. O'Brien, a clerk in the office of John P. Connally, Clerk of the Court of Criminal Correction, and an old-time St. Louis soccer and baseball player, died yesterday of a brain tumor at his home, 4125A St. Louis avenue.

Mr. O'Brien, 52 years old, had been unable to attend to his duties since he was operated on last September.

He formerly played full back for the Innisfails, leading soccer team here from 1914 to 1920, and served several seasons as a catcher for minor league baseball teams, including Dubuque of the Three I
