News Item—Pitcher Pfyl of St. Louis has been signed by the Keokuk baseball team.

A jewel without a flaw is a rarity and a treasure that is prized for more than its intrinsic value. Refulgent gems of minor leagues frequently contain blemishes that the magnates, under whose critical examination they are subjected, put the stamp of disapproval on them and return them to the factory whence they came for polishing. While hobnobbing with the elite, said jewels scintillate with a dazzling brilliancy and luminous radiance that, when the flaw is discovered and the lustre labelled "meteoric," the polishing process often times result to the great detriment of the ornament. The splendour in such cases wears off until the once sparkling luminary with its flashing beams of light, retrogrades into obscurity. Such seems to have been the experiences of Pfyl. He was once a member of the St. Louis Browns, farmed to the minors and later relegated to independent semi-pro teams. Now he is with Keokuk in the Central Association. This season should tell whether he is of the 18-karat kind or not.
