Mr. Fred Warren, formerly of Punxsutawney, and brother of Mr. William Warren, of Brookville, died in his home in Hubbard, Ohio, on Friday, July 27, after an illness of two months.

Mr. Warren was born in Hasland, England, in January, 1862, being 89 years old at the time of his death. He experienced good health until two months ago when he suffered a heart attack.

His wife preceded him in death in November, 1950. He is survived by five children, Mrs. Paul Gray, of Reynoldsville, being the only one
