A RURAL ROMANCE.

Miss Schuler's Secret Marriage Consummated by an Alleged False Oath.

Mr. Joseph Schuler, who lives in the adjoining County of St. Charles, is the father of a beautiful daughter, Mary A., aged 15. About the first of last month she visited the city, and not returning within the time specified, her father visited St. Louis to find out what detained her. Much to his surprise he discovered that she was living with John Webb, of Barrett's Station, St. Louis County, and claimed to be his wife. Mr. Schuler knew that he had not only not consented to his daughter's nuptials, but he was decidedly opposed to her marriage, especially to Webb, so he proceeded to investigate the matter. He learned that a ceremony had been performed, and that Justice Giovanoni had officiated. Calling upon the Justice he found that a license had been issued from the Recorder's office, St. Louis, on March 5, 1883, empowering the Justice to unite in matrimony John Webb and Miss Mary A. Schuler, both of Barrett's Station, and that the Justice had complied with the request of the contracting parties. Making inquiry at the Recorder's office it was found that an application for a license numbered 8,498 was on file, wherein John Webb had sworn that Mary A. Schuler was aged 19, and that Mary A. Schuler had also signed an affidavit to that effect, but not being able to write had made her mark. Mr. Schuler says that his daughter can write; that Webb procured another girl to personate her at the Recorder's office, and that his child knew nothing of the license or the procuring of it. He also says that Webb will not give him any satisfaction in reference to the matter, but on being pressed said a woman was with him when he obtained the license. Mr. Schuler feels very sore at what he considers the outrage that has been perpetrated upon him and the deception practiced upon his daughter, who, he says, was persuaded into the step. He proposes to see if there is any law to punish his son-in-law for making a false oath.
