Mr. Hatfield was a retired farmer and a former employee of Haynes Stelite, Kokomo. From 1906 to 1924, he played for several minor league baseball teams in the Midwest. He was a member of Lodge No. 601 F&AM, Converse, for more than 70 years, and also was a member of the Fort Wayne Scottish Rite and the Shrine. He was an Army veteran of World War I.
