Joe Doyle Gets Discharge. Joe Doyle, former Loyola Hall football and baseball star, who earned the title of "Babe Ruth of the Great Lakes," is home in St. Louis. He has received his honorable discharge from the United States Navy and will await the call to report for spring training

with the Cardinals. As third baseman of the First Regiment team of the Great Lakes Regimental League. Doyle attracted the attention of practically every major league scout in baseball. Charley Barrett, the "Old King Brady" of Branch Rickey's scouting bureau, slipped up on Doyle during one of his visits to St. Louis last summer and had him affix his signature to a Cardinal contract.

However, keen baseball judges who have watched him perform predict he has the makings of a star. He may not come through this season, but it seems almost certain that he will prove a valuable member of the Knot Hole Gang within a year or two.
