Brandon, Feb. 14.—Pitcher Heinrich, of Brandon, bought by the Chicago White Sox, leaves here Feb. 24th for Chicago to join Comiskey's team. Heinrich will accompany the Sox on their training trip. The White Sox party will include 40 players and will travel south on a special train. Heinrich is keeping in condition all the winter, and is confident he will be able to make a satisfactory showing with the major league outfit. Harry Schaefer, who played first base for Saskatoon last year, and regarded as the best first sacker in the league, has signed to play with Brandon next season. He has taken up his residence here. Schaefer is a left-hand thrower.

Two More Report.

Two more arrivals made up in part for the loss of the five let go on Tuesday. They are Catcher John Cooper, who finished the season behind the bat for the Hustlers, last year, and Harry Schaefer, the slugging outfielder who comes from the Brandon, Ont., club in the Western Canada league. Brandon last season was the leading outfielder in the Canadian league, hitting .301, besides having 39 assists from the field with the majority of putouts at the plate. He is expected to hold a place in the outfield when Dubuque opens with Quincy a week from Wednesday. Cooper arrived in the city from his home at Fairport, O., and looks to be in fair shape for a prosperous season.

The announcement was expected, for Schaefer despite the many opportunities given him by the Hustler boss, failed to show enough baseball to warrant his retention. Clarence Rowland was for a long time unwilling to let the outfielder go, and hoped against hope that Schaefer would break in the hit column and play a better game in the outfield. Instead of this, Schaefer fell down woefully in batting, fielding and throwing. He was signed after making a most wonderful showing in the Western Canada league last season, where he batted .309 with Brandon and Saskatchewan.

Hamilton Spectator.—A gloom was cast over the camp of the Hamilton Kolts this morning when Manager Lee announced that Harry Schaefer, the new first baseman, who joined the local club yesterday afternoon, coming all the way from Dubuque, Iowa, had been called home by the sudden death of his father, which took place Wednesday. Schaefer reported to Manager Lee late yesterday afternoon and was soon at home with the squad, Lee congratulating himself that the team was at last completed. Shortly after midnight, however, the jinx made himself felt, when Lee was routed out of bed by a telegraph boy who had a message for Schaefer. This proved to be a telegram from Schaefer's home in Erie, Pa., to the effect that his father had died on Wednesday, the message having gone all the way to Dubuque and then back to Hamilton. According to the telegram, the funeral services are to be held to-day, and although the Erie boy left for home first thing this morning it is doubtful if he will arrive in time for the funeral. He stated before he left that he would join the Kolts again on Sunday at Niagara Falls, where they have an exhibition game with the Stars and Stripes, so that he will be on the job for the opening game with Peterboro here next Tuesday.
