**Bingham Talks.**  
DULUTH, Sept. 20.—In an interview Bingham, the ex-Duluth pitcher, against whom charges were brought of having sold the last Duluth-Oshkosh game, said: "I do not wish to enter into a controversy with any one who will entertain for a moment the idea that I am guilty of such conduct. At Oshkosh I used all the power I possess as a pitcher for the first two innings. Notwithstanding this fact I could not fool the opposing batters. When I saw the game was irrevocably lost, I did what any other pitcher would do—saved myself as much as possible. Yes, I shall play in the Northwestern league next season, but not with the Duluths at any price."

Once Star of Harvard Nine;  
Had Been Blind 3 Years;

Isaac E. Bingham, local attorney, died Monday night at his home, 2 Brookside avenue, after a long illness.

The funeral will be held from the residence at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon when services will be conducted by the Rev. Warren W. Churchill, minister of Hedding M. E. church. Burial will be in the Poughkeepsie Rural cemetery in the charge of Charles J. Schlude.

A native of Poughkeepsie, Mr. Bingham was born January 22, 1865 he gained nation-wide fame as a baseball player. He attended the local schools, finishing Poughkeepsie High school in 1882 and entering Riverview Military academy the same year.

Mr. Bingham became known as Harvard's star pitcher. After graduation from college he went to the west coast and played professional baseball under an assumed name. On his return to Poughkeepsie he entered the law offices of Losee and Harrick. Although blind for the past three years, he had been active until two months ago.
