What they think of him in New England is shown by the following extract from a Lawrence letter in the Sporting Life: "That foxy old veteran, good natured Tim Murnan, slipped out here and carried away Mike Bradley's Eignature attached to a Kansas City contract. Lord Timothy, you secured a jewe!, one of the finest general players in the New England league, a good out or in fielder, batter, fast runner, and his habits are such as to make him an ornament to any club."

His position being second base, settles the question as to whether Billy Higgins will be signed, the latter having been asked for his terms.


