He commenced his professional career two years ago with the Atlantics of Brooklyn as centre fielder and catcher, and last year played second base for the Springfields. He led his club at the bat and stood second in fielding. This year his services were secured by the champions to cover second base, in which position he excels and leads the League. As a batter he ranks among the foremost. "Tate" is a hard worker, and by his cool judgment as a captain greatly assisted the champions in many a game.

Tim Brosnan, 2d base and captain, is 5 feet 8 in ches in height and weighs 160. He plsyed in 1885 in Breckton, in the N. E. League, standing first among second basemen with a batting average of 313. Last season he played with Bryan at Charleston, being captain of the feam and standing third as second baseman in that association. From there he went to the Brockton N. E. League, and stood first among the second basemen of that lesgue, with a batting average of 314. He is a quick, st arp hitter, and a fine base runner, and a better second baseman never played. As a captain on the ball field he is second to none. He is called Pap Brosnan by the players, although he is young, being only 26 years of age.




Tim J. Brosnan Options #2 and #3
