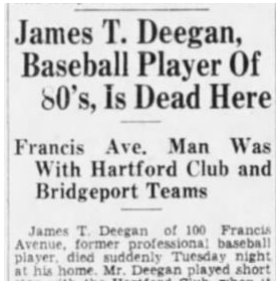

June 2, 1884

James Deegan, late of the Bridgeports, has signed with the New Britains and is playing third base.

New Haven Morning Journal Courier September 1, 1885

Deegan is playing third base in good style for the New Britains. The Bridgeports had no use for him in right field.

New Haven Morning Journal Courier September 3, 1885

James Deegan of this city is playing in the Troy club. On Saturday, at Adams, Mass., he pitched and played first base against the Renfrews, the latter club winning, 6 to 5.

Hartford Courant August 9, 1886

The correspondent of the *Daily Base Ball Gazette* was incorrect when he said the Hartford had fourteen men on their trip. Manager Daniels took eleven players, including Deegan, with him. Diven and Cramer did not go.

Hartford Courant April 23, 1887

The Amusement company do not feel that they can go into baseball this summer. The idea is therefore to let the Amusement company stay out and run a good amateur team with the addition of a professional battery. Among the local men who could be secured are Turner, catcher, an old league player; Jimmy Deegan, also a league player; Griswold, Redigan, George Bowers, Sheehan, Snow of Glastonbury, Stannard, Bob Smith, Riley, Gagal, Campbell, Blanchard and Brown. Out of this talent a very fair team could be made, and

Waterbury Evening Democrat March 14, 1888

Deegan and Dunn, of the old Bloomington club, were signed to-day for the new Davenport.

The opposing team will be composed of well known local players, as follows: George Dunn, catcher; Tom Brady, pitcher; Denny Coyle, first base; John Gaffey, second; James Deegan, third base; Gothers, short stop; fielders to be selected from Turner, Charles Dietrich, James Halpin, Frank Stannard and Campbell.

Ball Game Saturday.

The ball game on the Trinity grounds Saturday afternoon between the Foot Guard and the Hillyer Guard teams was a one sided affair, the Maloney-Moran Foot Guard battery winning the game, 13 to 2. The attendance was very fair and several good plays were made by each team but the Hillyers were not in it from the start. The teams were made up as follows:—

Foot Guard—Moran catcher, Maloney pitcher, Stannard first base, J. C. Cook second base, Cauty third base, Butler short stop, C. S. Cook right field, Graham left field, Weltner center field.

Hillyers—Sugrue pitcher, Turner catcher, Shea first base, Whalen second base, Gunning short stop, Smith third base, Penders right field, Deegan center field, Cosgrove left field.
Umpire, Jackson Brady.

James T. Deegan, Baseball Player Of 80's, Is Dead Here

Francis Ave. Man Was With Hartford Club and Bridgeport Teams

James T. Deegan of 100 Francis Avenue, former professional baseball player, died suddenly Tuesday night at his home. Mr. Deegan played short stop with the Hartford Club, when it was with the Connecticut State League in 1883 and '84, and with the same club when it was the Eastern League in '85 and '86. For several years thereafter, he played the same position with the Des Moines, Iowa, team in the Western League; with Bridgeport, in the Atlantic League, and with Newburyport, Mass., in the New England League.

Mr. Deegan was born in Hartford, the son of the late Patrick and Catherine (Kelley) Deegan. He was a master painter for 33 years, former Democratic chairman of the Tenth Ward and a member of Hartford Lodge, B. P. O. E.

He leaves his wife, Mrs. Annie (Mulhall) Deegan, six sons, James

He died on July 1, 1931, in Hartford, Connecticut, at the age of 67, and was buried in Bloomfield, Connecticut.
