OBITUARY.

George F. Dunn.

George F. Dunn, an old-time baseball player well known in his day, died yesterday morning at his home, No. 22 Canton street. He was 49 years old. He had been employed at Colt's Armory off and on for the past thirty-five years and continuously for the past twenty-two years as a skilled workman and polisher. His baseball days ended about twenty-two years

ago. In 1884 Mr. Dunn played on the Hartford team, forming part of the noted battery of Gruber and Dunn. In 1881, he played ball in Norwich, going from there to Manchester, N. H. Later he played at Davenport, Ia., with Clark Griffith, now manager of the Cincinnati National League team. Among his baseball contemporaries and friends were "Cap" Tobin, John Henry, James Deegan, Jack Farrell and Edward Beecher. Besides his wife, Mr. Dunn leaves two sons, William H. Dunn of Meriden and George F. Dunn of Norwich, and a stepson, Charles J. Claffey, two brothers, Policeman James Dunn and Thomas Dunn, and a sister, Mrs. Martin T. Felleter, all of this city.
