

The Danville club has been signing several players lately and they are good ones. Charlie Halstrom is manager, captain and pitcher. He stood far above the twiriers in the Northwestern league last season. Esterquest, another pitcher, played with Birmingham last season, ranking sixth out of 15 pitchers in the Southern league. Lotz, first baseman, played 40 games last season with only 6 errors. Belden Hill, from last year's Akron, O., team is second baseman. He is a sure hitter and heavy batter. For short stops they have secured Fisher and Lindley both good base ball men. Grim, Schnor and Newman will receive for them. Moyer will be center fielder and an amateur player whose name is White, will play left field. At a recent meeting of the directors of the Danville club it was decided to increase the capital stock to \$5,000.

Quad City Times Jan 9, 1888

The first business attended to were the cases of J. J. Noone and Albert Fisher. These two signed with Danville and accepted \$50 each as advance money. They also accepted \$25 each from Decatur. They kept the contracts sent by the latter city and returned them without signing after holding them two weeks. They also promised to sign with Bloomington. The board of directors investigated the matter and decided that Danville had the best hold upon Noone and that Crawfordsville was entitled to the services of Fisher.

Al Fisher, the new second baseman, came in this morning from Indianapolis. Al says he is delighted to get to Cedar Rapids and promises to acquit himself to the entire satisfaction of the fans. No one doubts his ability to do so. His work with the Peoria team last season was a revelation, and it is safe to say that in him Manager Hill has by far the best second baseman in the association. He is not as tall as Clem Kimmerer nor as bulky as Buck Ebright, but he is a fielder, a hitter from Sockville and a splendid base runner.

Albert E. Fisher was born at Indianapolis, Ind., where half of the population are ball players. He began his professional work at Champaign, Ill., in 1887. In 1888 he signed with the Crawfordsville, Ind., team, being released to Milwaukee later in the season. In 1889 he was a member of the Peoria team, playing the same position which has made him famous in minor league circles, second base. In 1890 he was with

Quincy; in 1891 with Peoria, when that organization won the Western association championship; in 1892 with Joliet and Montgomery, Ala.; in 1893 he left the diamond, but returned again the following year, playing with Quincy and Des Moines. In 1895 and '96 he was with Peoria again, but Manager Hill secured his contract early in the winter and he has been a valuable member of the champions. Mr. Fisher was married at Indianapolis last March, and with his wife resides at 208 A avenue west.
