### DEATH OF DR. S. W. INGRAHAM.

#### His Striking Personality and Professional Career—Sketch of His Life.

Sereno W. Ingraham, one of Chicago's old and prominent medical and surgical practitioners, died at 12:45 p. m. yesterday at the family residence, No. 845 West Adams street.

He had been complaining for some time, but would not cease his work until forced to go to bed last Monday night. He realized that he would never rise from his bed alive with the deadly combination of pneumonia and Bright's disease; he knew he was dying, and persistently refused to take any medicine.

He leaves two sons—Charles W., who is known as one of the best base-ball players in the Northwestern League, and is also a railroad man, and John M., who is an employé in the Post-Office.
