UMPIRE JEVNE FALLS FROM WINDOW AND CANNOT LIVE.

Chicago Man Nearly Mobbed at Ball
Game in Denver Fatally Hurt Later
in the Day.

Denver, Colo., Aug. 2.—[Special.]—Frederick B. Jevne of Chicago, umpire in the Western league, had a hot time this afternoon and narrowly escaped the hands of a mob displeased with his decisions. He had been drinking and was not considered responsible. He left the ball grounds complaining of his hardships, and at 11 o'clock was found on the sidewalk in front of the Victor Hotel. He fell from a third story window. His friends say he was pushed out, but residents across the street say he was sitting on the window sill and lost his balance. Doctors say his skull is fractured and he cannot survive.
