The Home Team Defeated in an Interesting Contest.
Persons at the ball park yesterday were treated to another exhibition of good ball playing. The Sioux Citys won by outbating the Maroons, though the field game of the visitors was inferior to that of the home team. Keogan, formerly of the Peorias, and Hoover formed the home battery. Keogan was wild. Wells and Shieldknecht were in the points for the visitors. Wells was effective, and held the Maroons to six hits, three of which Hoover made. Chicago scored only in the first and seventh innings. In the first Haurahan hit safely to right centre, stole second, and went to third on Shieldknecht's wild throw to catch him at second, scoring while Turner and Keogan were retiring the side on grounders. In the seventh Hoover lined the ball to left centre for a base and scored on Moriarity's

Chicago Tribune August 14, 1888

Signed a Pitcher.

Mathew Keogan, who pitched for last season's Chicago Maroons, was signed by Secretary Morton yesterday. Keogan has the reputation of being the best pitcher in the association in point of coolness and hard work. Last season he was exceedingly successful when against the strongest teams of the association. As a fielder he also ranks highly. He is now in Cincinnati.

Star Tribune February 3, 1889

Two Cincinnati players are looking on with interest at Cleveland's fight for Pitcher Sprague. Minneapolis claims a transfer of franchise holds the Chicago Maroons' reserve players. Cleveland begs to differ, and, if Cleveland wins its case, such a legal decision in its favor will free Fulton and Keogan, who are claimed by Morton under precisely similar circumstances. Knowing ones assert that Cincinnati will play in Philadelphia on Decoration Day and the Athletics have the Fourth of July date in Chicago. The Reds will doubtless be the Labor Day card in Brooklyn.

Topeka State Journal Feb 2, 1889

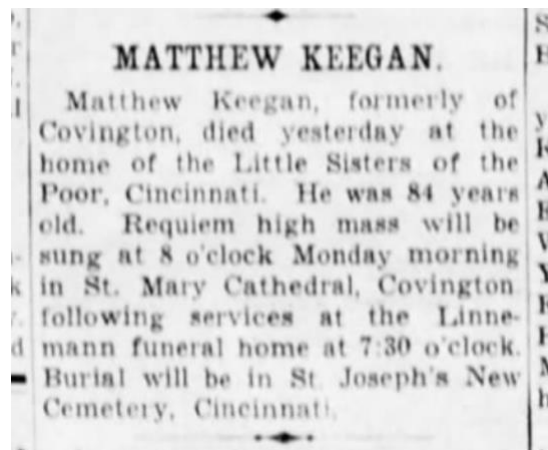
