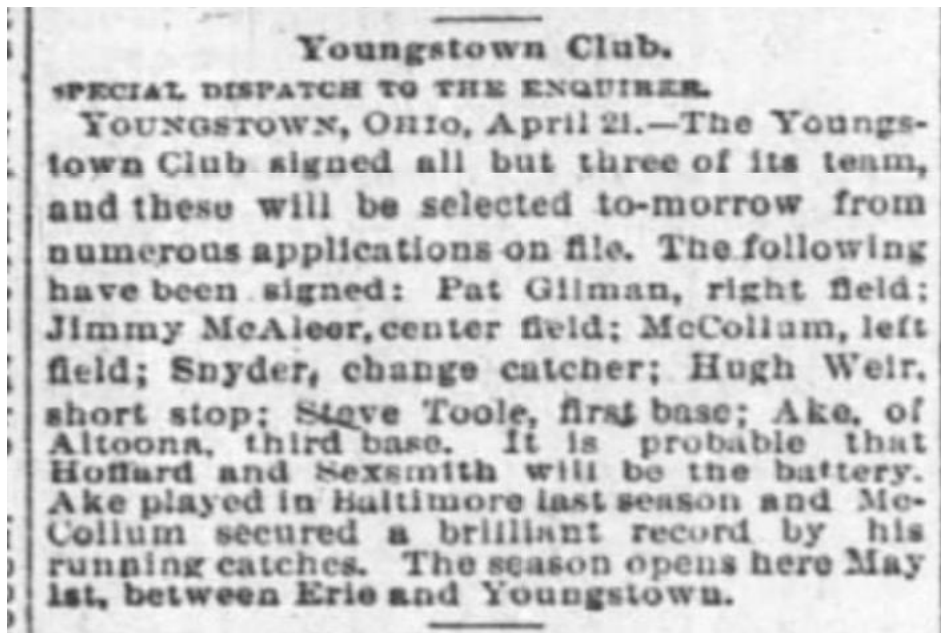

**Outfielder McCullom.**

Thomas McCullom, whose likeness is the above, is a Pennsylvanian, being born in the smoky city of Pittsburgh, in 1860. His height is 5 feet 6 inches, and his weight is 150 pounds. His first essay as a professional player was with the Neshanocks, of New Castle, Pa., in 1884. The next season he joined with Youngstown, G.; in 1886 he linked fortunes with the Milwaukee team and last year played with the Eau Claire's. Thomas is at present in his native city, anxiously waiting for the season to open.

## Thomas McCollum Dead.

Thomas McCollum, 50 years old, a veteran of the baseball diamond, a former member of the old Pittsburgh baseball club, and a fellow player of Governor John K. Tener, Ex-Sheriff Addison C. Gumbert and County Commissioner Stephen J. Toole, died yesterday in the home of his brother-in-law, George W. Leslie, 35 Junilla street.

Mr. McCollum was born in the old Fourth ward. Aside from the able manner in which he took care of the second base on the Pittsburgh team in the old days, he worked for the old Neshannocks, of New Castle, and played with the teams of Sharon, Milwaukee and Erie.

During the winter season of 1889, while working on a railroad, he was injured about the head, from which he never sufficiently recovered. The last few months of his life he was paralyzed and almost totally blind. He was a member of the Catholic church. Two sisters, Mrs. Hannah O'Neil and Mrs. George W. Leslie, survive.
