McArthur, another Detroit pitcher, and Robinson, who caught both Lawrence and McArthur, have just been signed by Lincoln. Secretary Leadley of Detroit National League club says of the former: "McArthur is as good as any pitcher so far signed in the Western league. He has had the necessary experience, is very speedy and has a good head. With Lawrence and McArthur in the box you are invincible." Of the catcher, Robinson, he writes: "He is an extra good catcher, a hard hitter, fine base runner, as well as a first class all round player. He is five feet eight and one-half inches high and weighs 175 pounds, is plucky and a good, swift thrower to bases. I advise other Western League clubs to fight shy of the "Wolverine" batteries in the Lincoln club."</p>	<p>Myer C. Robinson, the Cass Club catcher, has decided to enter the professional arena, and yesterday signed a contract to catch for the Lincoln, Neb., Club, of the Western League. The Detroiters have early started in on the accident business. Tom Gillen is the first victim. He writes that in exercising he injured his right wrist so severely he can neither throw nor catch. In this emergency Manager Watkins has engaged Myers C. Robinson, catcher of the Cass Club, to go South with the Wolverines. Myer is quite clever behind the bat. He has signed with Lincoln, of the Western League, and will stay South with the Detroiters until March 25, when he will have to report for duty at Lincoln.

Detroit Free Press Mar 3, 1887

M. C. Robinson of Detroit is the man who has been signed to catch Lawrence, the phenomenal twister. He is said to be a first class man and will no doubt be a tower of strength to Lincoln. Manager Threw has received the following from the secretary of the Detroit club: J. H. Threw, esq.—Dear Sir—M. C. Robinson, your catcher, has gone south with the Detroit team. He will report at Lincoln whenever you want him, but as one of our catchers is sick, our manager will use Robinson in exhibition games. It will give him good practice, and when he shows up in Lincoln he should be in good shape. He will get far better practice in the south than in the gymnasium.

Nebraska State Journal March 8, 1887

The Lincoln league team played a practice game of ball with a picked nine from the city yesterday afternoon. Lawrence and Robinson played with the select nine, which needed a battery, but the remaining positions were filled by amateurs. Several spectators were present.

The game was a walk-over for the Kalamazoo boys, the score being 11 to 1 in their favor. Burke and Briordy of the Detroit National League team were the battery for the Round Oaks and they were badly rattled by the attack Kalamazoo made on them; Burke was knocked out in the fifth. Aldrich pitched in great form for Kalamazoo, and was ably supported by Robinson behind the bat; the fielding of the home boys was superb.

M. C. Shaw is another Detroit boy. He was born there just 23 years ago and now weighs 170 pounds—a thorough heavy-weight. He started with the famous amateur Cass club of Detroit and made his first professional engagement in the spring of 1887 with the Detroits, from which club he was transferred to Lincoln, Neb., and purchased by the St. Joseph, Mo., club in July. He remained with them until August, when they disbanded. Then joined the Kalamazoo's, with whom he finished the season. That team won the pennant of the Ohio league. His batting average in the Western league was .312, although reports say if he had his just due it

would have been an average of .423. His fielding average at third base was .888. In the Ohio league his batting average was .390, with standing tie for fourth place of batsmen. With the Kalamazoo's he played second base and scored an average for fielding of .901, standing third among the second basemen.



