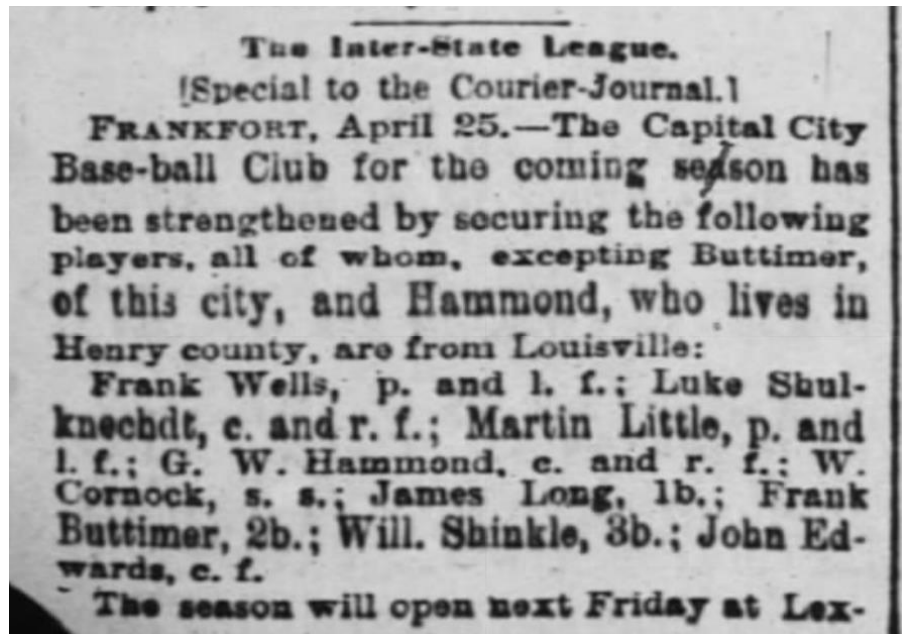

Schildknecht and Frank Wells came out of Louisville

Harrison played first base to perfection and his batting was magnificent, while Shenkle covered third base beautifully, put every ball that came near him squarely into Harrison's hands, and was a sure hitter with the bat. We venture the assertion that no club in the Interstate League can show two better basemen than our own first and third. Schildknecht and Wells played center and right field and took in several very pretty flies.

Frankfort Roundabout May 9, 1885

Tuesday night Manager Franklin went to Lexington, signed Reeder, Connelly, Flynn and Crogan, of the disbanded Lexington Club, and brought them home with him next morning. By the addition of these new men the club was greatly strengthened, and Wednesday's game was much more interesting. The ladies were admitted free and a much larger crowd was in attendance. McLaughlin was again put in to pitch, with Schildknecht to catch him, and the score was as follows:

Louisvilles won by the score of 20 to 1. For the Falls Citys the only men who played a good game were Shreve in the pitcher's box, Hager at left field, and Shenk at the bat. Welker dropped several flies in right field, Hewett played a poor game at second, and Schildknecht had more than a dozen passed balls. He was very plucky, however, and was the only man in the team who dared to face Shreve. The Louisvilles also played poorly, despite the weakness of their opponents. The
