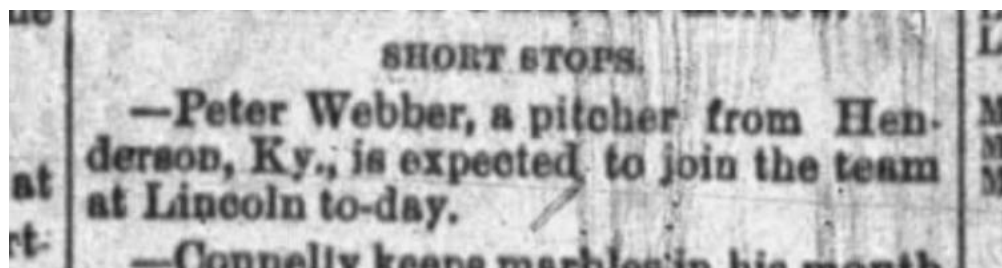

The game was not stirring, and was void of special features, excepting a catch of a fly to right field by Black, who made a desperate run and succeeded in making a double play. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Sophia Hack Webber, and two daughters, Mrs. Duncan Graham and Mrs. Wesley Rutledge.
